

PROJECTS INVOLVING LAKE CAMPBELL IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION

Here is a chronology of projects that LCIA (Lake Campbell Improvement Association) has been involved in over the years. First is a list of abbreviations for the projects.

GF&P: South Dakota Game, Fish & Parks
DENR: South Dakota Department of Environment and Natural Resources
EDWDD: East Dakota Water Development District
BCD, LCD, MCD: Brookings, Lake, Moody Conservation Districts
LCSD: Lake Campbell Sanitary District
WI: Water Institute, SDSU
EPA: (Federal) Environmental Protection Agency

- 1986-1989 Study/report of identity and treatment of critical non-point source Sediment and Nutrient Producing areas for Lake Campbell. (WI)
- 1987-1989 Dredging project: 190,000 cubic yards removed at north and south end of the lake. Stopped for study (DENR, LCIA, & others)
- 1990-1993 Study/report: Phase 1 Diagnostic/Feasibility study of Lake Campbell. (DENR, LCIA, DENR)
- 1994-1995 Proposal: Lake Campbell/Battle Creek Watershed Project (319 Project Proposal). (BCD, LCD, MCD, LCIA, DENR)
- 1994-1995 Lake Campbell Sanitary District (LCSD) incorporated. (LCIA, LCSD)
- 1996-1997 Lake Campbell Sanitary District facilities plan-phase 1, estimated cost \$1.5 million completed. (EDWDD, LCIA, Banner's Inc.)
- 1999-2000 Lake Campbell dam replacement. (75% GF&P, 25% LCIA)
- 2001-2002 Watershed improvement assistance. (LCIA)
- 2004-2006 Handicapped accessible fishing pier and a new dock on the north end of the lake. (75% from GF&P, 25% from LCIA)
- Road grated and repaired down to the dock. Time and equipment donated by Mike Syrstad. New deck installed on the bridge on the south end of the lake. (SD Highway Department & Moody County)
- 2007 Lake water sampling. (EDWDD, LCIA, & volunteers)

- 2010 An updated aerial map of Lake Campbell showing all the lots with the names of all the folks on the back of the map. (LCIA)
- Donated money to the Sportsman's club to support improvements of the club. (LCIA)
- 2011 Updated the Lake Campbell Improvement Association tax exempt status. The LCIA had not filed an annual report with the State of South Dakota since 1996. We are now current and submitted all the back reports. (LCIA)
- File a Form 1023 – Application for Recognition of Exemption under Section 501©3, to get reinstated for exempt purpose with the IRS.
